Theme Ideas from Ministry Matters

According to the psalmist, day and night pour forth speech and reveal knowledge, but no words can contain their truth (Psalm 19:2). Additionally, God's law is perfect, reviving the soul. The very decrees of the Lord make the wise simple (v.7).

How do we understand these teachings? When shared by creation, do we even know how to listen? When Nehemiah read the Book of the Law of Moses to the people, he had to give the meaning so that they would understand. In Corinth, Paul looked for the Spirit to bind the church together through the power of Christian baptism, because teachings on Christian unity were falling on deaf ears. Even the people in Jesus' hometown could not see the truth of who he was, as Jesus read from the scroll of Isaiah. The very heavens reveal the knowledge of our God, and the precepts of God in scripture are perfect, but without help understanding them, we often remain blissfully unaware.

Prayer from Ministry Matters (Nehemiah 8, Psalm 19, Luke 4)

God of Wisdom, we have come to sit at Jesus' feet and learn to what he would teach us. With the heavens above and the earth below, we rejoice in the good news he brings: succour to the poor, release to the captives, recovery of sight to the blind, and freedom for the oppressed.

Reveal the mystery of your precepts, that we might hear the music of the heavens—the whisper of the land and roar of the seas, the prayer of the caterpillar and song of the flea. Speak to us through the fullness of creation, we pray.
