Theme from Ministry Matters

The readings from 2 Kings, Luke, and Galatians look at times of transition, turmoil, and transformation. As the time nears for Elijah to ascend to heaven within the whirlwind, Elisha discovers his unique gifts of spiritual leadership. By pledging to follow Elijah as disciple, helper, and son, he gains experience, guidance, and his teacher's blessing. Likewise, Luke speaks of the time before Christ ascends to heaven, when his disciples also learn what it will take to follow him wherever he goes.

The Galatians passage adds Paul's advice to believers—to act in accord with the Holy Spirit. He urges them to become living fruit of the Spirit, using their unique gifts for the kingdom of God.

Public Housing Tower Demolition - JustAct June 2025

JustAct's feedback on issues church members most want it to focus on placed 'Curbing Homelessness' at the top of the list. That makes its continuing concern with demolition of inner Melbourne public housing towers particularly relevant. The May JustAct newsletter requested that we write letters to the Victorian Government regarding housing 'reforms' for public housing towers in inner Melbourne. These 'reforms' will remove residents from their current homes in public housing towers while redevelopment takes place. That will remove them from their communities as well as their homes.

Once redevelopment is finished there will be a substantial reduction in the amount of public housing available to low income people.

At the start of April, residents of the public housing towers opposed to the current redevelopment plans lost a class action in the Supreme Court. The Victorian Government stated that it will pursue recovery of its legal costs against the tenant that led the class action. The case was pursued on behalf of 479 households from three public housing towers in Flemington and North Melbourne. The tenants' lawsuit argued the government failed to properly consider residents' human rights when it decided to demolish the towers. Further, the tenants argued that the Victorian Government failed to consider other alternatives, such as retrofitting the towers.

JustAct asked us to urge the Victorian Government to engage in a genuine co-design process with current residents regarding its plans to redevelop the public housing towers. JustAct wants to thank everyone who wrote letters in response to this article. If you did not get a chance to write letters in response to the action in the last JustAct it is not too late to do so. Letters can be addressed to the Victorian Premier (Hon. Jacinta Allan) or Minister for Housing and Building (Hon. Harriet Shing).
