SCRIPTURE READINGS

For the next four weeks, we will be following the **Season of Creation** readings. Today's readings are:

Genesis 1 Psalm 8 John 1:1-13

Web:

Season of Creation: Ocean

In Genesis 1, we read of God giving humans dominion over the earth. This 'dominion' is to be understood, not as a directive to plunder and ravage, but in the sense of a ruler who reigns with care for all things within their realm. In the ancient world, the local king would have responsibility for the people, the rivers, the forests, responsible agriculture and all the resources that fall within their domain. The wellbeing of the people depended entirely upon the well-being of the land and waterways. The well-being of the people also depended upon the laws in place to ensure the people lived respectfully with one another in community together. The poetic rendering of the mythical creation narrative assumes a benevolent human responsibility for the earth and its oceans and waterways. Today our focus is on the oceans, so it is helpful to remember that all of creation is dependent upon the health of the oceans, as the oceans are dependent upon the well-being of human society, land and skies.

May our wakeful listening penetrate the earth and reach toward the heavens.

May our bold tenderness overcome our ignorance and enable wise action.

"Are you here to see the birds of paradise or the sea life?"

It's the kind of question people in West Papua ask foreigners. Here between rainforest and reef, it's only the occasional wildlife biologist, adventure tourist or David Attenborough film crew who passes through.

Few come here to ask about the people.

Frans is a fisherman, a grandfather, and runs a little shop from his home where three generations of his family live together. Each morning, he goes out to fish, catching just enough for his family to eat that day.

"There's no market here," he explained. "And the power is too unreliable for fridges."

Like so many in his community, Frans has watched the land and sea change around him.

"The floods come more often now," he told me.

"The shoreline is eroding. The hurricanes and king tides push seawater through our homes and gardens."

These changes are devastating for families who have always lived in deep relationship with the land and sea and are now struggling to feed their children.

Frans is determined, but hunger is growing. One in five children in West Papua is malnourished. Rates of stunting are among the highest in Indonesia.

The problems seem overwhelming. But there is a better way.

Our partner, the Evangelical Christian Church in the Land of Papua (GKI-TP), has a bold vision: to tackle poverty and environmental destruction side by side. They want to help families grow climate-resilient food gardens, support small businesses, restore forests, and train women and young people as leaders of conservation and human development in their villages.

It's practical. It's locally driven. And it has so much potential.

With your help, it can grow. Together, we can help families like Frans' build food security and income while protecting the forests, rivers and seas they depend on.
